

# Synopsis

Thumbelina is a tiny maiden who bloomed from a flower. She is no bigger than a thumb which is where she gets her name. One night, Thumbelina is taken from her home by two greedy toads. On her adventure trying to return home she encounters many different situations. She meets vaudeville dancing frogs, a snail longing for the sea, a kind spider, and a dramatic Shakespearian worm. Thumbelina experiences a tea party with some judgy insects and watches a magic show performed by a mole. She tries many things to get back home. Just when Thumbelina has lost all hope of ever getting home, she encounters magical fairies who come to her rescue. Their kindness helps her to get back home.

The overarching theme being that one thing that this world needs is more kindness.

Including performers who identify as a person with disability, BIPOC, First Nations, gender diverse, LGBTQIA+, neurodiverse and from any and all cultural backgrounds.

## Cast Obligations

\*While Child Players normally runs programs with a cast of children, we are looking for adults 18+ for this production.

- All participants over the age of 16 will be required to hold a WORKING WITH VULNERABLE PEOPLES card.
- You may not be called for every rehearsal or be required to stay for the entirety of a rehearsal, although you are required to attend all rehearsals you are called for. If you know in advance that you will be unavailable on any of the listed dates, please put this information on your application form. Attendance at rehearsals during production week and at all performances is mandatory.
- Child Players run their shows on a very small budget. You will be provided with costumes but will need to provide your own shoes. Also, there will be working bees helping with set and prop making. Any help with these will be greatly appreciated.
- Working as part of a team is important for the success of Thumbelina. Cast and crew are reminded to act with respect and bring a positive mindset to all rehearsals and performances.



#### Character Breakdown

Most Actors will play two to three roles. All roles are flexible with regards to gender and age.

Thumbelina will be younger than 16 and it has already been cast.

Toad One and Two - The toads are the villains of the show. They are not the smartest characters and very greedy. They are motivated by making money.

Insects / Ladybug, Centipede and Cricket - The insects are judgy and stylish. They have tea parties but don't invite other bugs and insects. They are mean to everyone they don't like but by the end of the musical have learnt how much kindness is needed in this world.

Frogs One, Two and Three - The three frogs are vaudeville dancers looking to star on Broadway. They get along together most of the time, however they are highly competitive, and this can cause friction between them.

Butterfly - Butterfly is friends with Ladybug, Centipede and Cricket until she meets Thumbelina where she finds out what a real friend looks like. Throughout the musical Butterfly learns the importance of friendship, and to thank Thumbelina for her kindness she introduces her to the fairies.

Spider - Spider is a friendly vegetarian with 153 kids. Spider helps Thumbelina try to get home until the rain comes and scares her away.

Mole - The magnificent, terrific, Wondrous Magical Mole is a wannabe magician who is passionate, however not so skilled, in magic. He lives with Mouse underground.

Mouse - Mouse is sweet and allows Thumbelina to stay in her place underground when it is raining. She lives with Mole and is his Magic Act assistant.

Worm - Worm is dramatic and cries about everything. He quotes Shakespeare and is sad about how the world sees worms.

Snail - Snail longs for the sea. Even though he has never been to the seaside or knows how to swim he knows that is where he belongs. Snail tries to convince Thumbelina to go to the sea with him but with no luck.

The Fairies - The fairies enter at the end of the play. They help Thumbelina to get home by giving her wings. There are four fairies all based on flowers or mushrooms.

# What to Expect on Audition Day

- Everyone auditioning will be required to book an audition time and fill out a google form before the audition.
- Please prepare two monologues from the monologues provided. Please ensure they are
  different characters. Please also prepare a 30 second to one minute song that you are
  comfortable with to share. A Bluetooth speaker and connection for most phone types will be
  available on the day for your song.
- You will be allocated a 10-minute audition spot to share your monologue and song.
- You are not expected to memorise the monologue but please familiarise yourself. Holding the monologue in hand is allowed.
- During the audition your photo will be taken. Your audition will also be recorded to assist the panel with their deliberations.
- You will be informed whether you are successful in the auditions by email or a phone call as soon as possible after the auditions and call-backs have been completed.

#### What to bring to your audition;

- A water bottle
- An instrumental backing track (a YouTube karaoke backing track is suitable)
- Comfortable clothing and footwear that you can move in.



### Monologues

\*Please pick two monologues of contrasting styles.

Toad: Do you also have a bad feeling in your stomach? I have this weird feeling in my tummy that I have never felt before. What is this feeling? I tried to take my daily nap earlier and I couldn't sleep. I didn't even eat lunch either because I feel... I feel... I think I feel guilt? We need to go find Thumbelina and help her get back home. When I have a problem, money is always the solution. We can tell her that she can make some money and join us, then we can pay someone to help her find her way back home.

Ladybug: Butterfly! It's great to see you. Nice of you to finally come. I was betting you would be 15 minutes late. (*All bugs laugh richly*) Who's your friend? (*To Thumbelina*) I couldn't imagine only have two legs and what a boring colour you are. (*Gasp*)... she doesn't have any feelers! No Spots! No wings! No personality!

Boring colour! No style! Small eyes. Two legs. How ugly.

Snail: I have been a lost soul on a journey for many months. I know my destination however I knew it was going to be a long and dangerous trip. I have been in the doldrums for a while, but I will NEVER give up! THE SEA! The beautiful blue sea is my destination. Where my soul will truly be happy and no longer lost. You should really get a movable home. You will never get lost if your home follows you everywhere. And as for friends and family. I don't need them. The waves will be my family, and the sand will be my friends.

Frog One: And a one and a two and a one, two, three, four. (*Toad one is leading the other toads in a dance but it's not going to plan*) Step, kick... Step, kick... and turn... then jazz hands while you (*Points to toad two*) do a backflip and you (*points to toad three*) lift me up and let me have my ... What? You can't do a backflip? We need to dazzle the audience. We are never going to make it to Broadway! I knew I should have gone solo.

Spider: Eat you! Oh, how horrible. Bless your heart. I couldn't think of anything worse. I am a vegetarian. I'm not going to eat you darling. I just finished eating a beautiful piece of banana cake. I have the recipe if you want it. Are you lost, Honey? I have 153 kids. All doing their own thing now. But they all know their way back home. It's very important to me that I know that they are safe. That's why they all send me a lot of snail mail. It takes up most of my days trying to respond to all 153 of them. Lucky, I have 8 legs, so I can write 8 letters at a time. Here let me get you out my web.

Butterfly: I was once a plain insect without all my colour and grace. You three were not my friends when I was a caterpillar but once I was deemed worthy by you, you started talking to me. You don't care about my personality... you only care about looks and that's not right. You're all mean, and I don't want to stand here and not speak up. I feel sad about what you said to Thumbelina, and I have come to realise that you are not real friends. Friends should be supportive of each other. I was a bad friend to Thumbelina, but I won't be a bad friend anymore.

Worm: In sooth, I know not why I am so sad. But I am. There are too many reasons to mention. I am merely a worm in this cruel world. In a world filled with birds I am a worm. What's in a name? That which we call a rose by any other name would smell as sweet. Or one named a worm will still always be a worm and nothing else even if called by another name. I will always be just a worm. To be a worm or not to be a worm: that is not the question because I can never not be worm. One cannot change their fate.

Frog Two: Toads! How dare you. We are FROGS. We look nothing alike. I can't believe people get us mixed up. Toads have bumpy, dry skin covered in warts. Frogs actually take care of their skin. I moisturise. The toads wish they could jump high like us. Instead, they have to stomp everywhere. Can you believe. Toads. HA!
